MEET KANCHI

"It's only me and my grandmother in our little house. She is 72 years old but still works - that's how she gets food for us."

Kanchi is 10 years old and lives in rural Nepal. Until recently, she had no chance to go to school. The nearest government school was too far away, she simply couldn't travel across the rough terrain.

Then one day, everything changed. UWS Nepal built a school near Kanchi's village. Now she finally has a chance for a better future, "My favourite subject is Mathematics, I feel great when I'm able to help my friends with their studies too."

UWS Nepal has transformed thousands of lives like Kanchi's. In Nepal we have built 63 schools, trained 68 teachers and reached over 12,000+ students.

MEET BHOPA



Bopha grew up in the village of Tien in Cambodia. UWS built a school here, and Bopha had the chance to receive education for the first time.

Bopha's goal was to become a teacher, and she went to secondary school after passing her exams. She has now completed her teacher training and returned to UWS Tien as a teaching assistant.

Not only is she using her own education to teach the next generation of children from her village to read, write and count, she is also inspiring them to pursue their own goals and dreams.

UWS Cambodia has transformed thousands of lives like Bhopa's. In Cambodia we have built 96 schools to reach thousands of children get educated.

FUNDRAISING IDEAS

Let's make change happen! Big changes start with small actions, and action starts with you.

Here are a few of our favorite examples and an A-Z of different ideas that we have seen work brilliantly, and get creative. Your hobby could raise money that, donated to UWS, will give a child the chance to access a life-changing education. So what are you waiting for?

Embark on a personal challenge!

Sporting Edition:

Are you a sports enthusiast or looking to try something new? Consider setting a personal challenge with a sponsored sporting event, making your fundraising journey uniquely yours!

Sponsored Walks:

Address one of the significant barriers to education worldwide—long distances from home to school. Demonstrate your empathy for children facing the challenge of walking up to 3 hours to reach school. Commit to walking to school for a week and seek sponsorships for your efforts.

Give it Up Challenge:

Put your self-discipline to the test by giving up a daily indulgence, whether it's chocolate, soda, or even talking! Request sponsorships or encourage direct donations equivalent to the amount you would typically spend on these items.

Can you embrace the challenge and make a positive impact?

A-Z FUNDRAISING IDEAS

Art Auction: Organize an art auction featuring students' artwork. Invite parents and community members to bid

on the pieces.

Bake Sale: Host a bake sale where students and parents contribute homemade treats. Consider themed sales for holidays or special occasions.

Car Wash: Set up a car wash in the school parking lot.
Students can offer to wash cars for a donation to the fundraising cause.

Dance Marathon: Organize a dance marathon where students collect pledges for every hour they dance. Hold the event in the school gymnasium.

Environmental Clean-up:
Arrange a community
clean-up day where students
pick up litter in local parks or
neighborhoods, and pledge
donations can be based on
the amount collected.

Fun Run: Plan a fun run or walkathon where participants gather sponsors for each mile or lap completed.

Garage Sale: Encourage families to donate gently used items for a school-wide garage sale. All proceeds go towards the fundraising goal.

Hat Day: Designate a day where students can wear a hat to school in exchange for a small donation. Ice Cream Social: Host an ice cream social with various toppings and flavors. Charge an entrance fee or per-scoop donation.

Jigsaw Puzzle Tournament:
Organize a puzzle competition
where teams or individuals
compete to complete jigsaw
puzzles in the shortest amount
of time. Participants can
gather sponsorships.

Karaoke Night: Arrange a karaoke night with students, teachers, and parents showcasing their singing talents. Charge an entry fee for the audience and participants.

Lemonade Stand: Set up a lemonade stand during school events or in the community. Students can create unique flavors and collect donations.

Movie Night: Host a movie night at the school with a small admission fee.
Consider selling popcorn, snacks, and drinks to increase fundraising.

Nature Hike: Plan a walk in a nearby park or scenic area. Participants collect pledges based on the distance they hike. Incorporate identification of local flora and fauna, and and learn about conservation.

Outdoor Olympics: Organize a day of outdoor sports and games with an entry fee for participants. Events can include sack races, three-legged races, and tug-of-war.

Plant Sale: Partner with local nurseries or garden centers to sell plants, flowers, or seeds. Students and parents can purchase items for their

gardens.

Quilt Raffle: Create a quilt with contributions from students and parents, then raffle it off to raise funds.

Recycling Drive: Collect recyclable materials such as cans, bottles, and paper. Partner with a recycling center and use the proceeds for the fundraising cause.

Sports Tournament:
Organize a sports tournament
for various games like soccer,
basketball, or volleyball.
Teams pay an entry fee, and
spectators contribute to
watch the games.

Talent Show: Host a talent show featuring the skills and performances of students, teachers, and community members. Charge an admission fee. Underwater-themed Day: Have a "Under the Sea" themed day with underwater decorations, costumes and activities. Collect donations for participation.

Virtual Challenge: Create a virtual challenge where participants commit to activities like running, walking, or reading, and gather sponsors for completing the challenge.

Wacky Wardrobe Day:
Designate a day where
students and teachers can
dress up in wacky or
themed outfits for a
small donation.

eXtreme Sports Day: Host a day at your school or sports facility for skateboarding, BMX biking, rock climbing, etc. Participants and spectators can make a donation to attend the event.

Yoga in the Park: Arrange a community yoga session in a local park. Participants can contribute a donation to join the class.

Zoo Day: Organize a visit to a local zoo with discounted tickets for students and families. The proceeds from ticket sales go towards the fundraising goal.


DONATE YOUR BIRTHDAY OR SCHOOL ANNIVERSARY

THE STEPS OF YOUR FUNDRAISING JOURNEY

LOGISTICS

Now it's time to think about how your event will work practically. If your event needs a venue, when and where will you hold it? What will you need and who will be involved? Do you have a budget? How do you plan on raising and collecting money?

Planning this out will be really useful in the long run!

INSPIRATION

Come up with your own fundraising event idea. Are you going to do it yourself? Are you going to do it with your class?

PROMOTING

Make sure people know about your event! In the next couple of pages you'll find posters, sponsorship forms and target sheets to get you started.

Think about how you can reach out to people, and the best ways to promote your event throughout your school and on social media.

DONATING

After all your hard work, don't forget to send your donations! See our Donate page on our website.

SPREAD THE MESSAGE!

EMAIL YOUR CLOSE CONTACTS

Reaching out to close contacts of the school is the best place to start when launching a fundraising campaign. People are more likely to donate when they have a personal link to the cause, and your school and students are that link! Make sure your communications are tailored for each person. These initial donations will give your fundraising page its first push.





USE SOCIAL MEDIA

If you or your school have social media accounts, use them!

Add images and facts to engage your audience in your progress and cause. Our website has lots of useful content you could include. You could even write a blog post about your journey. And don't forget the link to your fundraising page. You want donations, not just likes!

Celebrate landmarks in your journey! If you've reached half way to your fundraising target, let people know. They'll want to help you get to the finish line. And why not widen your scope? You could engage local networks by speaking at an assembly or community event. Ask our local radio station or newspaper to publicise your event too.





SAY THANK YOU

Once it's all over, remember to thank everyone who supported you, and remind them of the difference their contribution will make. We've added a postcard in this booklet that you can use for this. 
